- Know that Jesus' miracles reflected the beginning of the Kingdom and show us what God is like

- Deeds- An action performed intentionally, that can have a good or bad outcome
- Faith- Complete trust and confidence
- Invitation- a request asking you to go or to do something
- Justice- Being fair and reasonable
- Kingdom-A realm associated with or regarded as being under the control of a particular person or thing
- Miracles- An event attributed the divine intervention of God
- Parables-A simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson, as told by Jesus in the Gospels
- Reflection- Time for serious thought and consideration
