Communication and Language		Talk about stories using new vocabulary to build familiarity and understanding. Retell the story of Dear Zoo using some exact words from the text. Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development		Build constructive and respectful relationships with peers and adults. Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others. Manage their own toileting, dressing, washing and drying hands and eating their lunch.
Physical Development inc Forest School		Hold a pencil correctly using the 3 friends hold. Move safely around others and have an awareness of space inside and outside. Explore the Forest School Site and watch the season change from Summer to Autumn.

Maths		Count objects, actions and sounds to 5 and beyond. Match numbers to an amount of objects. Compare numbers using the vocabulary 'more than' less than' and 'the same as'
Understanding of the World		Talk about members of their immediate family and community. Name and describe people who are familiar to them using their All About Me Box. Explore the natural world around them including in Forest School.
Expressive Arts and Design		Sing simple songs in a group or on your own. Develop story lines in role play and small world activities. Use paint, chalk and crayons to express their ideas using different techniques.
