

Easter Art Ideas

Paper Plate Peek-a-Boo Bunny

Supplies

- Paper plate
- White card
- Paint
- Googly eyes
- Cotton wool ball
- 2 split pins
- Felt-tip pens



- 1 Take the card and place the paper plate onto it, then draw around the paper plate.
- 2 Now choose a colour for your bunny and paint both the card circle and the paper plate in this colour, then leave to dry.
- 3 Cut out the card circle and fold it in half. Shape the circle by making one end slightly pointed and making the other end slightly square; these will form the bunny's ears.
- 4 Using the glue, stick the cotton wool ball to the middle of the paper plate.
- 5 Using felt-tip pens, draw some whiskers and a mouth on to the bunny.
- 6 Also stick some googly eyes onto the face.
- 7 Finally, join the ears onto the head by pushing the split pins through both ears and the head. Then pull out the split pins at the back of the plate to secure.

Handprint Chicken With Chicks

Supplies

- White, orange, red, yellow and green paint
- Blue card
- Black, red, orange and green felt tips
- Paint brushes
- Paint pots



- 1 Use your finger dipped in green paint to print a line of grass along the bottom of the card.
- 2 Use white paint to print a handprint with the fingers facing upwards and thumb on the left just above the grass line. Then leave to dry.
- 3 Paint your thumb with yellow paint, then print three or four thumbprints spread out along the grass. This will create the body for the chicks.
- 4 Paint your index finger with green paint and print just above each thumbprint to create the chick's heads.
- 5 Add a few overlapping fingerprints in yellow and red in the middle of the palm print to create a wing for the chicken, leave to dry.
- 6 Draw eyes and beaks on the chicks using a black felt tip pen.
- 7 Using red and orange felt pens draw a comb on the hen as well as eyes and a beak.

Easter Box Chick

Supplies

- Coloured Card
- Glue Stick
- Two egg box segments
- Scissors
- Yellow paint
- Googly eyes
- Paint brush



- 1 Trim the egg box segments so that there are no loose edges.
- 2 Stick a small strip of card to one side of the egg box, leaving an overhang.
- 3 Turn the second egg box segment upside down, then sit it on top of the first egg box segment, and attach them together using the strip of card.
- 4 Paint the outside of both segments yellow, then leave to dry.
- 5 Now make the beak for the chick. To do this, fold a piece orange card, then draw a triangle, making sure that it is against the fold.
- 6 Cut out the triangle.
- 7 Draw two small feet from the left over card and cut out.
- 8 Now glue all of the features onto the egg box chick; first glue the feet onto the base and the eyes onto the front. Then open the chick and glue the wings and beak on, then leave to dry.
- 9 Fill with tissue paper and small chocolate eggs or other treats.

Egg Box Bunny

Supplies

- Coloured Card
- Glue Stick
- Two egg box segments
- Felt-tip pens
- Scissors
- Paint
- Googly eyes



- 1 Trim the egg box segments so that there are no loose edges.
- 2 Add a small strip of card to one side of the egg box, leaving an overhang.
- 3 Turn the second egg box segment upside down, then sit it on top of the first egg box segment, and attach them together using the strip of card.
- 4 Paint the outside of both segments, then leave to dry.
- 5 Draw two ear shapes onto card, colour them in the same colour as the body of the bunny, and then cut them out.
- 6 Draw two small feet from the left over card, colour them in then cut them out.
- 7 Glue the feet onto the base of the bunny and the eyes onto the front. Finally, glue the ears onto the top of the bunny and a pom-pom tail on the back, then leave to dry.
- 8 Fill with tissue paper and small chocolate eggs or other treats.
