Science, History or Geography	<p><u>Geography</u></p> <p><u>How do people's homes at Kampong Ayer compare with mine?</u></p> <p>Please read the following extract to your child, they can draw a picture once they have listened to the description of Kampong Ayer. It's going to be a special picture because they have never seen Kampong Ayer.</p> <p><i>Kampong Ayer is a 'water village' built in the middle of a wide river. In fact it is the largest water village in the world. Approximately 30 000 people live there in about 4000 dwellings. Because Kampong Ayer is near the sea the river in which it has been built is affected by tides. At high tide the river can be three metres higher than at low tide when a lot of mud is uncovered. Strong winds can quite often cause large waves on the river. Very heavy rain storms are another problem that Kampong Ayer has to cope with.</i></p> <p>On a piece of plain paper encourage them to draw what they think the homes at Kampong Ayer look like based on the description they have read.</p> <p>Discuss what your child has drawn and encourage them to explain their rationale and reasoning for what they have drawn.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ <i>how will people travel to and from their homes?</i> ➤ <i>how will they prevent water flooding their homes?</i>
