Below are some suggestions for learning that your child can do at home this week. We understand that the situation is unprecedented, however we do recommend that the children stay in touch with their learning using the ideas given below. You can help keep your child in contact with the school via the email link shown at the end of this message. Your child may want to share their achievements with their teacher by photographing or scanning it and sending it via email. A teacher will reply with a comment about the work shared.

We are going to try and have a Year 5 assembly this week, on Thursday 18th June at 10:45, if you can bring a piece of home learning about the Rainforest, we might have the chance to share it with the rest of Year 5! This is the first time we will have tried this, so if we don't get the chance to show your work then there will hopefully be more chances in the future. We'll try and run the assembly for about 10-15 minutes, if you could mute your microphone and use the chat instead then we won't all be talking over each other!

	English: WW2 "Beyond the Lines" Watch the film clip of a D-day landing at <u>https://www.literacyshed.com/beyondthelines.html</u> After watching the clip, you could use the film to generate ideas to support your writing. You might decide to choose from the list below, or come up with your own way of writing or story telling about the short film.
	 Discuss and write about how the men on the boat would have been feeling as they huddled on the boat on their way to their impending doom. Think about how to develop a piece of writing that reveals that all is not what it seems; introducing the boys and giving clues about the soldiers. Create setting descriptions of the battleground and also of a contrasting place and compare the use of specific vocabulary such as colour and mood. Write a first person narrative through the eyes of one of the children, one of the unknown soldiers or 'young' Grandad. Create a third person narrative retelling the story as we see it on the film. Discuss the meaning of the paper men.
