	Environment	The conditions of a place for example, hot, cold, wet or dry.
	Habitat	The environment where an animal or a plant lives or grows.
	Ocean	One of the five very large areas of salt water on the earth's surface.
	Pollution	Where water, air or land becomes dirty or dangerous
	Sea	A large area of salty water that is usually surrounded by land.
	Seaside	An area that is close to the sea, and where some people go on their holiday.
	Tide	The change in how high the oceans or seas are where the ware flows away from or back to the land.
