Key ideas

Vocabulary 10

Bible	Christian scriptures, consisting of the old and new testaments in a book called a Bible.
Covenant	An agreement
Faith	A strong belief
Inclusiveness	Including all people regardless of money, religion, gender or disability
Kingdom	An area under the control of a leader. The Kingdom of God- Heaven where God presides
Miracle	Something that cannot be explained. A miracle shows the power of God
Parables	Stories told by Jesus with a deeper meaning that explains a spirit or moral lesson
7 Sacraments	Baptism, Eucharist [Holy Communion], Reconciliation, Holy Orders, and Matrimony and Anointing of the Sick
Signs	An action or something that may have a deeper meaning.
Values	Standards of behaviour; people's judgement on what is important to live as part of a community- honesty, courage, justice, forgiveness and love.
