Dear Parents, I need your help. Since arriving at the school many years ago, our beautiful statue of Our Lady, for its safety has been chained to the fence, so it didn't get knocked over. As we are approaching May, the dedicated month for honouring Our Lady Mary I thought it was time to unchain her and place her more prominently and respectfully in our grounds. Our Lady Mary is sometimes known as the Queen of May and flowers are placed before her recognising her importance. 


These children have been chosen to be the summer lerm language ambassadors.


