HOW do we identify and assess children with SEN?

Discussions with:

- Parents/carers
- Teachers
- Pupils
- Outside agencies
- Information from assessments and observations

HOW can this school meet your child's needs? Every child's needs are considered on an individual basis. We adapt the curriculum for children with SEND in the following areas:

- Language and communication
- Cognition and learning
- Social, emotional and mental health
- Sensory and physical needs (hearing impairment; visual impairment; multisensory impairment)
- We use various resources and specialised equipment to support each child
- Transition meeting with pupils, parents/carers and other professionals as appropriate

WHAT types of support are available for my child in school?

- High quality teaching by the class teacher
- Targeted 1:1 and/or small group specialised interventions e.g. speech and language trained TA (SaLT)
- Outside agency support and advice
- Details of the support being provided for your child can be found in the Learning conversation record

Any continued concerns should be raised with the SENCo, Headteacher or SEN Governor.
