and life everlasting. Amen.

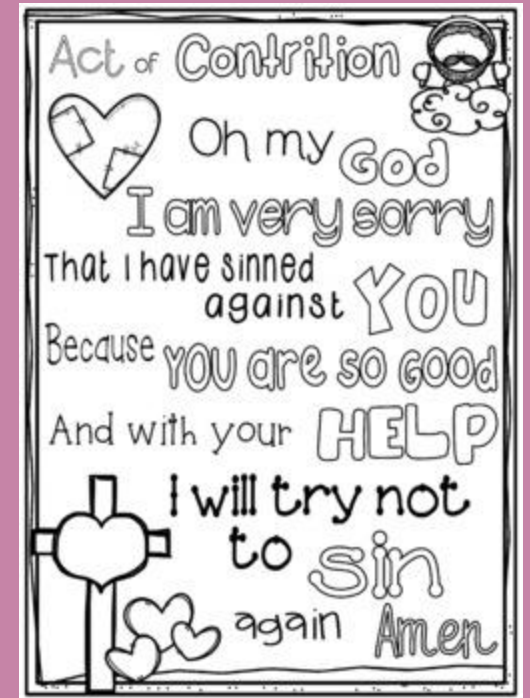
# The Act of Contrition

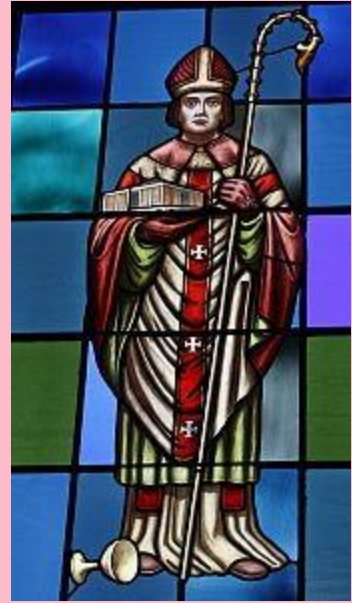
# Prayer of St Richard of Chichester

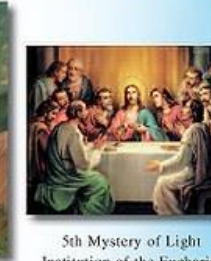
